

The Proclamation of the Word

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah *Reader: Rosemary Smith*

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the

house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "*Do not be afraid; for see--I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.*" And suddenly there was

with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "*Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!*" When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "*Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.*" So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. *Luke. 2:1-14*

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth, we give you

mother; in him we have seen a new and radiant vision of your glory.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent
your only Son to be our Saviour. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the
Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he
proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the
sorrowful, joy.

To fulfil your purpose he gave himself up to death and, rising from the grave, destroyed death and made the whole creation new. And that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfilment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end: at supper with them he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "*Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.*"

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "*Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.*"

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith. *(Sung)*

Father, we now celebrate the memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Father, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Grant that all who share this bread and this cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ to the praise of your name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace. Remember *Justin* the Archbishop of Canterbury and *Fred*, the Primate of all Canada, together with our Bishop, *Ron*. Remember *Michael* our Rector, the clergy of this parish and everyone who ministers in your Church.

Remember all your people, this Christmas Eve who seek your light and your truth, especially this congregation of St. John's. Remember all those who are in need of our prayer, all those who are ill and in need of hope. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is

known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

Grant that we may find our inheritance with the blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of our Lord, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with St. John, Patron of this parish and all the saints who have found favour with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Breaking of the Bread

All Thanks be to God.

**Jesus Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world,

have mercy on us.**

**Jesus Prince of Peace you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world,
grant us your peace.**

The celebrant and people then receive communion.
The body of Christ (given for you). The blood of Christ (shed for you).
The communicant responds each time, **Amen.**

We welcome all who wish to be nourished with the Body and Blood of Christ. If you wish a blessing instead, please fold your arms. There will be three stations for Holy Communion, at the Altar and at the head of each side aisle.
